AusTender provides centralised publication of Australian Government business opportunities, annual procurement plans, multi-use lists and contracts. You need to register to use AusTrade, but this service is free. You get automatic notification of business opportunities and are allowed electronic lodgement of



tender responses into a secure electronic tender box.
